



# Year 6 Curriculum Web – Autumn 2 2021

<b>Writing</b>		<p>This half term we will be reading <i>Once</i> by Morris Gleizman and <i>Rose Blanche</i> by Roberto Innocenti as our fiction text and we will be reading <i>World War II</i> as our non-fiction text. We will also be studying the poem 'Charge of the Light Brigade' by Tennyson. In our writing lessons we will focus on writing to inform through letter and report writing and building on our descriptive writing from this term. We will be developing our consistency in tense, using short sentences to create tension in our writing and using a variety of sentence structures.</p>	<b>Science</b>	<p><u>Light</u></p> <p>In science, we will be investigating the way light travels, how light helps us see and how shadows are formed. We will be study reflection and refraction through a series of investigations. We develop the scientific skills of using evidence to support my ideas, planning a fair test to test predictions and evaluating our results.</p>	<b>PSHE</b>	<p><u>Relationships</u></p> <p>In PSHE lessons, we will be looking at the difference between a marriage and a civil partnership, what consent means, what a forced marriage is and how to access risk of online challenges and dares.</p>
<b>Reading</b>		<p>This half term we will be reading <i>Once</i> by Morris Gleizman and <i>Rose Blanche</i> by Roberto Innocenti as our fiction text and we will be reading <i>World War II</i> as our non-fiction text. We will be developing our consistency in tense, using short sentences to create tension in our writing and using a variety of sentence structures.</p>	<b>Music</b>	<p><u>Rhythm</u></p> <p>In music this half term, the children will continue to work with the wonderful Mr. Fisher – our music specialist. They will sing a range of songs and learn about key notations, rhythm and pulse.</p>	<b>Computing</b>	<p><u>Creating Media-Vector drawing</u></p> <p>This half term, the children will find out that vector images are made up of shapes. They will learn how to use the different drawing tools and how images are created in layers. They will explore the ways in which images can be grouped and duplicated to support them in creating more complex pieces of work.</p>
<b>Maths</b>	<p><u>Place Value/Geometry/Multiplication and Division</u></p> <p>In maths, the children will be securing their number facts within 100 to enable them to fluently apply this knowledge to measure and percentage later in the year. The children will continue to secure their place value of numbers up to 10,000,000. They will draw, compose and decompose shapes. We begin our learning of multiplication and division and secure both mental and written strategies.</p>	<b>Art</b>	<p><u>World Peace Poppies</u></p> <p>The children will be studying the impressionist movement. We will particularly focus on Claude Monnet's <i>Field of Poppies</i> painting. We will be learning about how the techniques that these artists used and how they chose to draw and paint outdoors and the way they tried to capture the effect the sunlight had on what they were painting. They will apply these techniques to their own work.</p>	<b>RE</b>	<p><u>Buddhism and Christmas</u></p> <p>This half term, the children will be introduced to some of the festivals of light across some of the major religions. They will learn about why these festivals are important to their followers and how they celebrated. This will then lead into their learning about Christmas, discussing the significance of light as well as different versions of the Christmas story.</p>	
<b>History</b>	<p><u>World War II</u></p> <p>In history, we will learn about the causes and countries involved in WWII and the chronology, how WWII impacted daily life in Britain, the experiences of evacuees, what the Holocaust was and the key events that contributed to the Allies' victory. This half term we will learn the following skills: Construct informed responses that involve thoughtful selection and organisation of relevant historical information and note connections, contrasts, and trends over time.</p>	<b>PE</b>	<p><u>Gymnastics</u></p> <p>The children will perform increasingly complex sequences, combine their own ideas with others to build sequences, compose and practise actions and relate to music. They will also work towards improving their competency across a broad range of gymnastics actions.</p>	<b>Spanish</b>	<p><u>Spanish</u></p> <p>In Spanish, children will be learning to communicate their likes and dislikes, consolidating and imbedding new language and learning to different persons of the regular AR verb. They will practice saying what they eat and drink for lunch on different days, practice looking up new nouns in a dictionary and continue to expand upon their language and grammatical understanding.</p>
